


CADET/SENIOR CADET LONG SLEEVE

------- AUSTRALIAN AIR LEAGUE BADGE POSITIONS FOR CADET/SENIOR CADET LONG SLEEVE SHIRT

We trust these simple instructions will help you set up your son's or daughter's uniform and give a uniformity to the display of badges on the uniform. If you have any questions ask the Officer Commanding of your child's Squadron.

GETTING STARTED



EDUCATION BADGES

The first badge awarded will be a General Proficiency (GP) badge (Item 7 above). This should be placed down the centre line of the left sleeve with the top of the badge placed in line with the top of the placket (cuff opening) seam. Subsequent higher GP awards replace the previous award. The AAK Badge is placed 2cm above the elbow line centre left sleeve.

Subsequent education badges are added alternatively on either side of the GP badge until the first (lower) row is filled (5 badges). Please ensure that a 3mm gap (approximately) is left between badges on all sides. If a higher class badge is awarded it replaces the lower class badge. The second and third rows also start from the centre.

Ensure the correct badge goes on the correct sleeve (the first badge on the right sleeve also starts centre sleeve with the bottom of the badge in line with the placket seam).

LEFT SLEEVE

TIE PIN/BAR

The tie pin/bar is worn horizontally so that the badge is in line with the shirt pocket buttons.

SERVICE BARS

Service Bars (Item 5) are awarded for each year of service and are placed on the right centre sleeve 2cm above the elbow line.

RANK INSIGNIA

The Chevrons for NCO rank (Item 3) are to be worn in the centre of both sleeves approximately midway between the shoulder seam and the elbow line.

INSTRUCTOR BADGES

Education Instructor Badges are placed on the left centre sleeve below the bottom row of Education Badges as shown in Plate 4 (1).

CADET OF THE YEAR


The Cadet of the Year Badge is worn in the centre of the flap of the right breast pocket..

DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD

Duke of Edinburgh Award is worn in the centre of the flap of the left breast pocket.

CADET CAP BADGE

The Cadet Cap Badge is worn on the left front of the Forage Cap with the wing tip 13mm from the two small black buttons on the front of the cap. The cap is worn straight and level on the centre of the head.




AUSTRALIAN AIR LEAGUE

BADGE POSITIONS FOR JUNIOR CADET SHORT SLEEVE SHIRT

We trust these simple instructions will help you set up your son's or daughter's uniform and give a uniformity to the display of badges on the uniform. If you have any questions ask the Officer Commanding of your child's Squadron.

GETTING STARTED

The Membership Flash (Item 1 below) is positioned centre left sleeve 12mm from the shoulder seam. Be sure to match the thread with the material. You can buy invisible thread but this is difficult to work with.



EDUCATION BADGES

The first badge awarded will be a General Proficiency (GP) badge (Item 7 above). This should be placed centre left sleeve with the bottom of the badge approximately 5mm above the colour band.

Subsequent education badges are added alternatively on either side of the GP badge until the first (lower) row is filled (5 badges). Please ensure that a 3mm gap (approximately) is left between badges on all sides. If a higher class badge is awarded it replaces the lower class badge. The second and third rows also start from the centre.

AUSTRALIAN AIR LEAGUE -

Ensure the correct badge goes on the correct sleeve. The first badge on the right sleeve also starts centre sleeve with the bottom of the badge approximately 3mm above the colour band.

SERVICE BARS

Service Bars (Item 3) are awarded for each year of service and are placed on the right centre sleeve 1cm above the education badges if possible.

RANK INSIGNIA

The Chevrons for NCO rank (Item 2) are to be worn in the centre of both sleeves. How crowded each sleeve is will depend upon which badges the member has but the chevrons must be placed in the same position on both sleeves relative to the Membership Flash (Item 1).

INSTRUCTOR BADGES

Education Instructor Badges are placed on the left centre sleeve below the bottom row of Education Badges. Refer Plate 4 (3).

CADET OF THE YEAR AWARD

Cadet of the Year Award is worn in the centre of the flap of the right breast pocket.

CADET CAP BADGE

The Cadet Cap Badge is worn on the left front of the Forage Cap with the wing tip 13mm from the two small black buttons on the front of the cap. The cap is worn straight and level on the centre of the head.


