## 8.0 Meritorious Service Award.

8.1 The Council of the League approved procedural changes to the issuing of the Meritorious Service Award, and approved that Section 17 para 10.4 is changed to read. 'The Chief Commissioner, or the Group Executive Commissioner if delegated.... And be awarded at an appropriate function decided by the Group Council and approved by the Chief Commissioner'.

## 9.0 Officers Rank on Epaulettes.

- 9.1 The Council of the League approved new Officer epaulettes.
- 9.2 The epaulettes will be manufactured from similar material to the Officers uniform and will have the appropriate rank embroidered in to it so as the bars continue to the underneath seam of the epaulette, in the correct order/position as detailed in the Australian Air League Manual for rank positioning.
- 9.3 The embroidery is to be of a ribbed design so as to being as close as possible to the existing bullion in design/colour, and to be the same width as specified in the A.A.L. Manual for the bullion.
- 9.4 These epaulettes are <u>NOT</u> to be worn on Tunics. Only the correct bullion is approved for wearing on the tunic.
- 9.5 Supply of the correct epaulettes will be through Group Quartermaster stores and are not to be 'Home made'.
- 9.6 A phase in period of 5 years is allowed however all Officers should be wearing them by  $1^{st}$  January 2005.

## 10.0 <u>GST – New Tax System</u>

- 10.1 All Units are again reminded that they are not to register for an ABN Number, as this will be actioned at Group level if required.
- 10.2 The Chief Commissioner wishes to advise that Federal Finance Commissioner is the only person who is authorised to contact external bodies with regard the matter of G.S.T.
- 10.3 For information our ABN number is 66 585 094 906 and the League is registered as an income tax exempt charity.
- 10.4 Any queries should be directed to your Executive Commissioners.

## 11.0 <u>The wearing of Medals</u>

- **11.1** The Council of the League has approved the additional conditions regarding the wearing of all A.A.L. Decorations (Medals).
- **11.2** Decorations (Medals) may be worn on the shirt, at 'Ceremonial occasions' only and must only be worn if a tie is worn. This does not apply to summer uniform.

- **11.3** Members attending and representing the A.A.L. at non A.A.L. functions in uniform, are permitted to wear decorations if required, provided that they are worn in accordance with the provisions of the A.A.L. manual.
- 11.4 Members attending and representing the A.A.L. at non A.A.L. functions in formal dress are permitted to wear miniature decorations if required, provided that they are worn in accordance with the provisions of the A.A.L. manual.

## 12.0 <u>Council of the Australian Air League.</u>

12.1 Members are again reminded that all references regarding 'Federal Executive Council' are now the responsibility of the 'Council of the Australian Air League'. The A.A.L. Manual will be progressively changed to reflect this change.

#### 13.0 Australian Air League Review 2002.

- 13.1 The 2002 A.A.L. Review is to be held on the weekend of the 5<sup>th</sup> of October on the Queensland 'Gold Coast'.
- 13.1 All units are advised to contact their respective Groups for travel and accommodation bookings.

## 14.0 A.A.L. Manual

- 14.1 All units are reminded that as each new section of the A.A.L. Manual becomes available the Groups are advised and it is up to the Groups to order the required amount for their respective members. Sections 5 and 10 are now available
- 14.2 Copying in any form, the A.A.L. Manual or any sections, is not permitted and will be dealt with severely.

#### 15.0 Leading Cadets

15.1 The Council of the Australian Air League has approved an increase in the number of Leading Cadets allowed within a Section to three (3) resulting in a maximum of nine (9) per Flight.

#### 16.0 Message from the Chief Commissioner

As we resume our Squadron Activities for the new year we face increasing demands to provide an Organisation that is interesting and stimulating that will attract young people to our ranks. In addition to other youth organisations, we face increasing competition from Sporting Clubs and Institutions plus extra School demands such as Bands and Study.

All volunteer organisations dealing with young people face a similar problem, an acute shortage of Adult Leaders.
