Part A - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.0 Intention

- 1.1 The New South Wales Boys' Group Annual Group Review and Field Competitions will be conducted on Sunday 12 September 2010 at Bland Oval and Lance Hutchinson Oval, Bonds Road, Riverwood.
- 1.2 **All Squadrons are required to attend** and are directed to take part in the Afternoon Parade. Squadrons with enough members to take part in Section Drill are also expected to compete in at least that competition.
- 1.3 All members of the New South Wales Boys' Group are requested to convey to as many parents and friends as possible an invitation to attend on this day where appropriate.
- 1.4 This Review is held in cooperation with New South Wales Girls' Group.

2.0 Dress

- 2.1 Members are required to wear full Australian Air League uniform as laid down in Section 18 of the Australian Air League Manual.
- 2.2 Medals and Decorations must be worn for afternoon parade. Name tags are not to be worn at any time during the day.
- 2.3 Jumpers are not to be worn during competitions or for the final parade but may be worn at all other times where required.
- 2.4 Membership Cards and Authority Cards must be carried for all rank and badges worn.
- 2.5 Members are also reminded that when travelling to and from the Group Review that their uniforms must be full and correct.
- 2.6 Members not in full and correct uniform will not be allowed to compete or take part in the Afternoon Parade. All Wing and Squadron OCs are expected to strictly enforce this directive.

3.0 Duty of Care to Members

- 3.1 It is the responsibility of all Squadron OCs to ensure that the members of their Squadron are fit and well throughout the day. Members who are feeling ill should not be allowed to take part in competitions or the afternoon parade.
- 3.2 Squadron OCs are to ensure members are provided with adequate shade, refreshments and sun protection at this Review.
- 3.3 Any injured or ill members are to be immediately referred to the designated Review First Aid Officer.
- 3.4 Wing OCs will ensure Squadron OCs within their Wing follow these directives.

7.0 Competition Areas

7.1 **Boys Group Competitions**

Boys Group competitions (except for Band and Ball Games) will take part on **Lance Hutchinson Oval**, which is the second oval away from Bonds Road. Squadrons should take this into consideration when setting up in the morning. Ball Games and Band competitions are scheduled to take place on Bland Oval. The reporting tent for all competitions (solo and field) will be situated on Lance Hutchinson Oval. Refer to *Appendix B, Field Competitions Map* for more details.

7.2 *Girls Group Competitions*

Girls Group Competitions are scheduled for **Bland Oval**, which is the front oval closest to Bonds Road.

8.0 General Conditions of Entry to Field Competitions

8.1 **Age Limits**

Members competing (with the exception of Officer Section Drill and Band Drill) in field competitions **MUST** be under the age of 19 as of **12 September 2010.**

8.2 *Uniform Requirements*

Members competing in field competitions must be wearing full Australian Air League uniform – see 2.0 above.

8.3 *Membership Requirements*

All members competing in field competitions must be current financial members of the Australian Air League. Members competing must have membership cards or proof of current membership (eg copy of receipt of joining fee)

8.4 *Entry to Competitions*

Squadrons wishing to enter morning competitions must do so by completing the attached Field and Band Competitions Entry Form (yellow form) and by delivering in person to the GFC or by one of the following means:

8.5 Entry Cut Off Date

Entry forms must be in the possession of the Group Field Commissioner by **Sunday 29 August 2010**.

8.6 Competitions as per 2010 Group Field Guide

8.7 Entry to Competition Areas

No Officer or NCO other than those in charge of or participating in the competing unit is allowed onto the competition area during the competitions without prior consent of competition staff or in an emergency.

8.8 Communication with Judges

Only competition staff may communicate with judges. Units whose members and associates who do not adhere to this requirement are liable for disqualification.

8.9 *Correcting Step in Competitions*

NCOs in charge of competing units may, with discretion, correct the step if required, however points will be deducted appropriately.

8.10 **Protests and Disqualifications**

All protests must be lodged in writing with the Competition Marshal within twenty (20) minutes of the completion of the concerned unit's competition.

- 8.10.1 Should a dispute arise over any decision, it will be referred to the Chief Marshal whose decision shall be FINAL.
- 8.10.2 Any Unit found cheating or being in any other way dishonest will be disqualified from that competition. Dishonest behaviour includes, but is not limited to, fielding NCOs with incorrect rank, competitors competing below their age groups, fielding non-financial members in competitions and interfering with the running of competitions.
- 8.10.3 The NSW Boys Group relies on units' honesty and sense of fair play when entering competitions. The Chief Marshal on the day however has the right to ask for proof of age, membership and/or rank where deemed necessary.

9.0 Field Competitions – Specific Conditions

9.1 **Squadron Section Drill**

9.1.1 All Squadrons may compete in Section Drill provided they have the correct complement. All members competing must be under the age of 19 as at 12 September 2010.

9.1.2 **Complement Requirements:**

9.1.3 *Total Number:* **6** including NCO in charge. Sections must have the full complement of 6

otherwise they are deemed to be non-competitive.

9.1.4 NCO in Charge: NCO in charge should be a Corporal. Where not available, a Leading Cadet

may be used. Where no NCOs are available, a Cadet may be used. NCOs of

higher rank than Corporal cannot compete in Section Drill.

9.1.5 Section Members: May have a maximum of **3** Leading Cadets and **no** Corporals in the section.

No section member can out rank the NCO in charge.

9.1.6 This competition is open to Squadrons only.

9.2 **Junior Section Drill**

9.2.1 All Squadrons may compete in Junior Section Drill, provided they have the correct complement. All members competing must be under the age of 12 as at 12 September 2010.

9.2.2 **Complement Requirements:**

9.2.3 *Total Number:* **6** including NCO in charge. Sections must have the full complement of 6

otherwise they are deemed to be non-competitive.

9.2.4 NCO in Charge: NCO in charge should be a Corporal. Where not available, a Leading Cadet

may be used. Where no NCOs are available, a Cadet may be used. NCOs of

- higher rank than Corporal cannot compete in Junior Section Drill.
- 9.2.5 Section Members: May have a maximum of **3** Leading Cadets and **no** Corporals in the section.

No section member can out rank the NCO in charge.

9.2.6 This competition is open to Squadrons only.

9.3 Wing Section Drill

- 9.3.1 This competition is primarily for Squadrons who do not have enough members to compete in Squadron Section Drill in their own right. Sections taking part in this competition must include at least one Squadron which does not have enough eligible members attending to take part in Squadron Section Drill. All individuals in a section must be from the same wing.
- 9.3.2 Other members for the section may come from other squadrons who are competing in Squadron Section Drill. However all persons taking part in Wing Section Drill must not also compete in Squadron Section Drill. In other words, individuals cannot participate in both Squadron Section Drill and Wing Section Drill.
- 9.3.3 Complement requirements are as per Squadron Section Drill (Section 8.1.2)
- 9.3.4 All members competing must be under the age of 19 as at 12 September 2010.

9.4 Officer Section Drill

- 9.4.1 All Squadrons and Wings may compete in Officer Section Drill provided they have the correct complement. This competition is open to Officers, Trainee Officers and Warrant Officers.
- Wings may compete provided that the members of the Wing's section do not also compete with 9.4.2 their Squadron.

Complement Requirements: 9.4.3

- 9.4.4 6 including Officer in charge. Sections must have the full complement of 6 Total Number: otherwise they are deemed to be non-competitive.
- 9.4.5 Officer in Charge: Officer in charge should be the highest ranking officer. Where applicable, they may be a Warrant Officer or Trainee Officer, provided no member of the section out ranks them. For the purposes of this competition, a Trainee

Officer is considered to out rank a Warrant Officer.

Section Members: May be Officers, Warrant Officers or Trainee Officers. No section member can 9.4.6

out rank the officer in charge.

This competition is open to Wings and Squadrons. 9.4.7

9.5 Flight Drill

9.5.1 All Squadrons may compete in Flight Drill provided they have the correct complement. All members competing must be under the age of 19 as at 12 September 2010.

Complement Requirements: 9.5.2

9.5.3 Total Number: **MAXIMUM** – **19** (including NCO in charge)

> MINIMUM - 13 (including NCO in charge). One point will be deducted for each member short of the full complement of 19. Flights with less than 13

members are deemed to be non-competitive.

9.5.4 NCO in Charge: NCO in charge should be a Sergeant. Where not available, a Corporal or

Leading Cadet may be used. Where there is a Squadron Sergeant in the squadron but no Sergeants, the Squadron Sergeant is permitted to take the

flight.

9.5.5 Minimum is 12, maximum is 18. No flight member may out rank the NCO Flight Members:

> in charge. No Sergeants or Squadron Sergeants may be a member of the flight. A maximum of 3 Corporals (who must be markers) and 9 Leading Cadets may be in the flight. Flight members are not to out rank the markers.

9.5.6 This competition is open to Squadrons only.

9.6 Flag Party Drill

9.6.1 All squadrons may compete in Flag Party Drill, provided they have the correct complement. All members competing must be under the age of 19 as at 12 September 2010.

9.6.2 **Complement Requirements:**

9.6.3 Total Number: **7** (including NCO in charge). Flag Parties must have the full complement for a

Flag Party with 3 flags.

9.6.4 NCO in Charge: NCO in charge should be a Sergeant. Where not available, a Corporal or

Leading Cadet may be used. Where there is a Squadron Sergeant in the Squadron but no Sergeants, the Squadron Sergeant is permitted to take the

Flag Party.

9.6.5 Bearers: **3.** Should be Corporal or Leading Cadet in rank. No ranks higher than

Corporal can be a bearer.

9.6.6 Escorts: **3.** Should be Leading Cadet or Cadet in rank. No ranks higher than Leading

Cadet can be an escort.

9.6.7 This competition is open to Squadrons only.

9.7 **Squad Drill**

9.7.1 All Squadrons may compete in Squad Drill, provided they have the correct number of participants. All competing Cadets and NCOs must be under the age of 19 as at 12 September 2010. There is no age limit for Officers (including Warrant Officers and Trainee Officers).

9.7.2 **Complement Requirements:**

9.7.3 Total Number: **MAXIMUM** – **19**. (**2** Officers, **17** Cadets with any amount of NCOs).

MINIMUM – **13**. (**2** Officers, **11** Cadets with any amount of NCOs). One point will be deducted for each member short of the full complement of 16. Squads with less than 13 members are deemed to be non-competitive.

9.7.4 Members: **Squad OC** (Must be an Officer, Trainee Officer or Warrant Officer)

Squad Adjutant (Must be an Officer, Trainee Officer or Warrant Officer and

cannot out rank the Squad OC).

1 Flag Party NCO

1 Flag Bearer (Carrying Squadron Flag – cannot out rank Flag Party NCO)

2 Flag Escorts (Cannot out rank Flag Bearer)

1 Flight NCO

Flight - At least 6 and not more than 12 flight members. Members of the

Flight cannot out rank the Flight NCO.

9.7.5 This competition is open to Squadrons only.

10.0 Band and Solo Competitions

10.1 **Band Competitions**

- 10.1.1 The compulsory tune for 2010 is "You're in the Army Now".
- 10.1.2 All Bands competing must be pre-registered with the Group Band Officer. Units are advised to contact the Group Band Officer to confirm their registration if unsure.

10.2 **Solo Competitions**

10.2.1 Solo Competitions are as follows:

10.2.1.1 **Snare Drum:** Junior (Ages 8 to 11)

Cadet (Ages 12 to 15) Senior (Ages 16 to 17) Open (18 and over)

10.2.1.2 *Tenor Drum:* Junior (Ages 8 to 11)

Cadet (Ages 12 to 15) Senior (Ages 16 to 17) Open (18 and over)

10.2.1.3 **Bugle:** Junior (Ages 8 to 11)

Cadet (Ages 12 to 15) Senior (Ages 16 to 17) Open (18 and over)

10.2.1.4 *Ages*

Ages are as at 12 September 2010. All members must compete within their age group. Any cadets/NCOs 18 years or older MUST compete in the Open Section.

10.3 Entry Forms

All members wishing to compete must be included on the attached Solo Competitions Entry Form (pink form).

10.4 Entry Form Cut Off Date

Entry forms must be in the possession of the Group Field Commissioner by **Sunday, 29 August 2010**, using one of the means described in section 7.4 of this circular.

10.5 **Start Time and Other Information**

Solo competitions will commence at 0830 hours, and it is the responsibility of individual Squadrons to ensure Soloists have completed their entries so as to participate in the Field Diagrams. Please note Field competitions will not be delayed for members participating in solo competitions.

10.6 Further Information

12.0 Dress

- 12.1 Members are required to wear full Australian Air League uniform as laid down in Section 18 of the Australian Air League Manual. Note officers are to wear tunics.
- 12.2 Jumpers are not to be worn for the final parade unless the Parade OC gives explicit instructions otherwise.
- 12.3 All medals and decorations MUST be worn. Name badges are NOT to be worn.
- 12.4 Members not in full and correct uniform will not be allowed to take part in the Afternoon Parade. All Wing and Squadron OCs are expected to strictly enforce this directive.

13.0 Duty of Care to Members

- 13.1 It is the responsibility of all Squadron OCs to ensure that their members are fit to take part in the Afternoon Parade. Members who are feeling ill should not be allowed to take part.
- 13.2 Squadron OCs are to ensure that their squadron members are sufficiently hydrated before the afternoon parade, and have also had something to eat.
- 13.3 Wing OCs will ensure that the Squadrons within their Wing have followed these directives.

14.0 Afternoon Review Competition Entries

14.1 Parade Statements

The attached blue Review Parade Statement must be completed and handed in by 1300 hrs on the day of the Review.

14.2 **Armbands**

Armbands **MUST** be collected when handing in Parade Statements.

14.2.1 Officers Commanding Wings and Squadrons only will wear an armband on their left arm, which will be worn halfway between the shoulder and elbow.

14.3 **Competitions**

- 14.3.1 Wing and Squadrons will be judged in competitions on the march according to their eligibility.
- 14.3.2 Competitions will be judged on the march as the Parade moves around the parade ground and will include the following:
- 14.3.3 **Best Group On The March** must be more than one (1) Group competing in the March competitions.

14.3.4 Best Boys' Wing On The March

14.3.4.1 *Qualifications:* Members at least **30** Squadrons at least **2**

14.3.5 **Best Boys' Squadron On The March**

14.3.5.1 *Qualifications:*

Total Members MINIMUM – 18 comprising of:

Officers At least 1

Flag Party Fully constituted (ie **3** flags, **3** escorts and **1** NCO in charge)

Flight At least one flight with at least **9** members plus NCO in charge. One point

shall be deducted for each member less than **19**, including the NCO. Squadrons may not field flights with more than **19** members in total.

Provided they meet the criteria for at least one flight, Squadrons with multiple flights will not be penalised for extra flights that do not meet this

criteria.

14.3.6 Best Boys' Small Squadron On The March

8.5.4.1 **Qualifications:**

Total Members MAXIMUM – 17

MINIMUM – **9** comprising of:

Officers At least 1

Flag Party Fully constituted (ie **3** flags, **3** escorts and **1** NCO in charge)

OR

1Squadron Flag, **2** escorts and an NCO in charge.

Flight Not more than **12** members plus an NCO in charge.

Those Squadrons deemed competitive according to the entry sheets will be judged in this category at the discretion of the marshals, and will not be competitive for the Best Squadron Trophy.

14.3.7 Best Boys' Flight On The March

14.3.7.1 *Qualifications:* MAXIMUM – **19** (including NCO in charge)

MINIMUM - 10 (including NCO in charge).

Must consist of at least ${\bf 1}$ NCO in charge and ${\bf 9}$ other members. One point shall be deducted from every Flight for each member less than ${\bf 19}$, including the NCO in charge. All flights within a squadron that meet this

criteria shall be eligible.

14.3.8 **Best Boys' Flag Party On The March**

14.3.8.1 **Qualifications:** Must be 3 Flag Formation (ie **3** flags, **3** escorts and **1** NCO in charge) as

per section 13 of the Australian Air League Manual. Any flag parties with

less than the numbers nominated above are non-competitive.

15.0 Afternoon Parade Order

15.1 Parade will assemble and march in the following order.

16.0 Afternoon Parade Procedure

16.1 March On

- 16.1.1 Units are to commence to assemble in column of route on Lance Hutchinson Oval when directed in the order as determined in paragraph 14.1 of this circular.
- 16.1.2 The Parade will make a circuit of Lance Hutchinson Oval for competition purposes, then enter the Bland Oval, passing the dais and immediately forming up (see Appendix C). No General Salute will be given.
- 16.1.3 The parade will form up as directed by the Parade Staff.
- 16.1.4 Once all units are in position, the Parade OC will give the order for all units to left turn into line and face the dais.

16.2 Presentations

16.2.1 Units are advised that if they are called to receive a presentation, the member accepting the award is to move quickly and smartly to the dais area.

16.3 March Off

- **Parade Hand Over**. At the conclusion of the presentations, the Group Executive Commissioner will order the Parade to attention and hand the Parade back to the Parade OC.
- 16.3.2 The Parade OC will order all flags to the carry.
- 16.3.3 The Parade OC will order the parade to turn right into column of route.
- 16.3.4 **March Off**. At the order, the parade will march and pass the dais.
- 16.3.5 **Eyes Right, General Salute**. At the order, in succession of units, units will perform an Eyes Right/General Salute as they pass the dais. All Officers will salute (unless in a flag party) and all Squadron, Wing and Group Flags will salute.
- 16.3.6 After passing the dais, the Parade will march to the rear of the parade ground. The massed AAL band will be assembled in front of the parade facing the dais and halt.

16.4 Final Ceremonies

- **National Anthem**. The National Anthem will play. ALL Officers salute and flag parties will perform a General Salute (ie only Squadron, Wing and Group Flags will salute).
- 16.4.2 **Group Flags March Off**. Following the National Anthem, the Group Flag Parties will be marched off the parade ground. ALL Officers will salute, and all Squadron and Wing flags will salute, as the Group Flag Parties pass their immediate front.

- 16.4.3 **Lowering of National Flag**. After the Group Flag Parties have been marched off, the Parade OC will give the command to lower the National Flag. ALL Officers will salute and flag parties will perform a General Salute (ie only Squadron, Wing and Group flags will salute.
- 16.4.4 **Order Flags**. Following the lowering of the National Flag, the Parade OC will order all flags to the order.
- 16.4.5 **Dismissal**. At the completion of the above all OCs will be called to report to the Parade OC for de-briefing and return of armbands. When all OCs are dismissed they will return to their units and immediately dismiss their units.
- 16.4.6 At the completion of the parade the Wing OC of the duty Wing is to ensure all members of their wing are available and present for Duty.

17.0 Results

When finalised and available, all units taking part in the competitions will be given a summary of where they lost points in order that they may be corrected for future competitions.

18.0 Trophy Return

- 18.1 Wings, Squadrons and Individuals holding perpetual trophies from last year's Group Review competition(s) must ensure that they are returned to the Australian Air League Headquarters, 181 Penshurst Street, Beverly Hills, in good repair, cleaned, polished and appropriately engraved, by 9 August 2010.
- Any Wing, Squadron or Individuals found not to have complied with paragraph 15.1 of this competition circular may be disqualified at the discretion of the Marshal from competing in this competition(s) for which they have not complied.

19.0 Education and Modelling Competitions

19.1 Units are advised to refer to the relevant Education Circular for full details on the Education and Modelling Competitions.

20.0 Canteen

20.1 A canteen will be operating on the day operated by Riverwood Squadron. No other squadron or Wing is permitted to sell food or refreshments.




